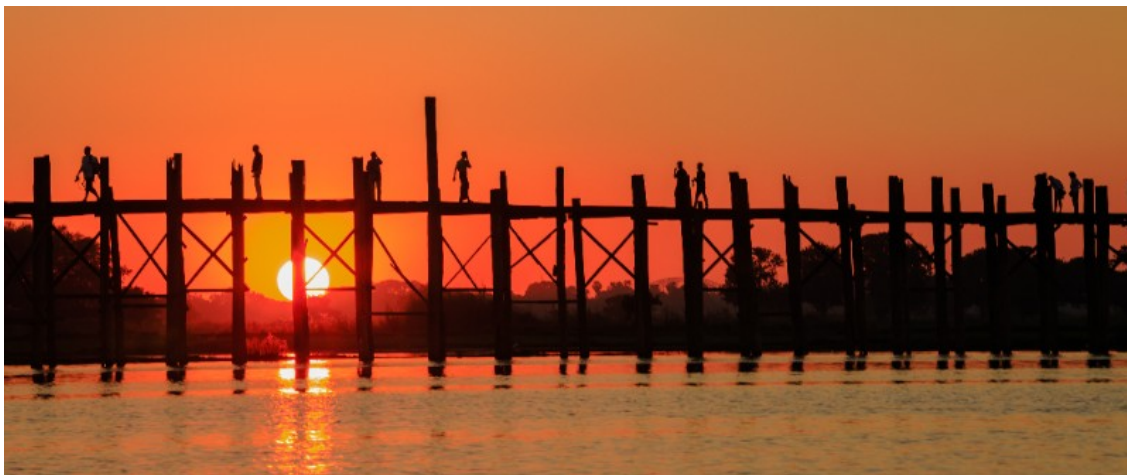

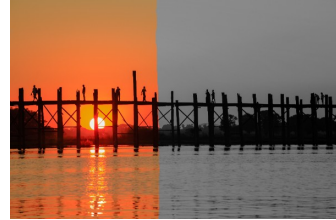
## Bobbie's Testimony
