Choirs and soloists energetically sang and danced before the Lord. A renowned drama troupe presented an inspiring interpretation of the Bible translation process. Spontaneous conga lines formed in celebration of the hard work and commitment of the translation teams. The translators themselves even formed a conga line, the joy on their faces and the movement of their bodies reflecting their gratitude for God's faithfulness to them through their years of labor. Distinguished guests from around the world, including Pioneer Bible Translators' president Greg Pruett, delivered convicting speeches that exhorted the recipients of these heart-language New Testaments to use them to draw near to God and to bring others into fellowship with Him."
